July 1, 2009, to current (Tier 2)	Age 65 with 5 years of service Age 60 with 30 years of service	Same

<sup>(a)</sup> Retirement eligibility provisions apply to regular KPERS members only. KPERS correctional members who retire immediately after leaving correctional employment may be eligible to retire at an earlier age than regular KPERS members.
